In preparation for this course, students need to identify a local public health agency/site wherein the student can collaborate with a supervisor for an observational (shadowing) learning experience. The student will seek opportunities to focus on a variety of public health concepts and public health roles as described in course readings and discussions. The student must complete assignments that will discuss and describe the site and the Public Health role in the community for the population served. The student must complete a cumulative total of twelve (12) hours of observational (shadowing) learning experience.

Students must complete and submit an Observational Learning Experience Agreement prior to the start of the experience.

The course instructor may contact the selected site, to inquire as to the student's experience.



12 Structured External Assignment Hours

This course is intended to provide the student with an overview of public health in the United States. The history of public health along with the growth of the public health system will be reviewed through readings, discussion board, and problem-solving activities. The course will present the relationship between population health and the community including the impact of social, cultural, and economic factors. Pertinent public and community health issues such as minority health, aging, chronic disease, communicable disease, and health care delivery will be examined.

At the conclusion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Define and understand the role of public health care
- 2. Understand the role and application of data in public health
- 3. Apply concepts of evidence based public health to current public health issues

4. Identify public health strategies used to address communicable disease, noncommunicable disease, and environmental health and injuries.

5. Evidence critical thinking skills in class discussion, written work, online assignments, and oral/visual/voice-enhanced presentations.
