Part 1: Using the Wilmington University Teaching and Learning Roadmap Format found with the SEA directions on Canvas, and your designated Content Standards, complete and submit an age-appropriate lesson plan which includes a variety of methods and materials to teach across the content area, including the application of critical thinking and problem-solving skills. The lesson must address cultural differences, different developmental levels, different learning styles and ability levels. It must also include both formative and summative assessment strategies, and digital-age learning experiences to plan, evaluate and strengthen instruction that will promote continuous intellectual, social, emotional, and physical development of each elementary OR secondary student (depending on your major).
