D. Course Assignments:

Discussion Board: The purpose of the Discussion Board is to share and exchange thoughts, ideas and opinions about public policy issues on a weekly basis. This means active involvement in dialogue with others in the Discussion Board Forum about the materials contained in the chapters of the textbook that you will be expected to read in advance of class, as well as articles about topics related to public administration

Analysis of a Public Policy article summaries: The purpose of the Analysis of a Public Policy article is to provide your perspective about the contents of an article that has been identified for you to review.

Opinion of Public Policy Paper (OPP): The purpose of the Opinion of Public Policy paper is to provide your opinion by responding to certain pre-determined questions.

Policy in a Picture: The purpose of the Policy in a Picture is to look at a picture or image and provide an interpretation of it from a public policy perspective.

Case Study: The purpose of the case study is to review a real-life scenario and answer questions about it from a public policy perspective.

Annotated Bibliography Summaries: The purpose of an annotated bibliography is to develop a systematic method of summarizing information about literature that you have reviewed while researching facts and data for a paper. The literature that you summarize in this assignment will be helpful to you when you write the final paper.

Quiz: The purpose of the quiz is to assess your knowledge of the materials covered in Chapters 1-8 in the textbook.

Point/Counterpoint Written Debate: The purpose of the debate is discuss the two sides (pro and con) of a topic from a public policy perspective in a written format.

Final Exam: The purpose of the quiz is to assess your knowledge of the materials covered in Chapters 9-16 in the textbook.
