GOAL C:

The student will demonstrate an understanding of the complexities in developing an effective community engagement plan.

Learning outcomes: The student will:

- C-1: Describe the challenges facing today's community organizers
- C-2: Research scholarly articles that focus on both sound community engagement theory and practice
- C-3: Examine requirements to build an organization ready to support community engagement activities

GOAL D:

The student will develop a familiarity with the skills needed to become an effective community organizer.

Learning outcomes: The student will:

- **D**-1: Through a SWOT analysis, identify the key focus areas to be incorporated into their community engagement plan
- **D-2**: Create a community engagement plan for a topic and/or organization of their choosing
- **D-**3: Incorporate relevant theories into their engagement plan
- **D-**4: Determine how to properly use traditional marketing and social media to promote engagement with the community
- **D-5**: Prepare a written plan for funding community development activities

GOAL E:

Students will analyze the ethical
